



Years 7 – 12 Music Scholarship Agreement

At The Friends' School, we seek to help our students develop as people who will think clearly, act with integrity, make decisions for themselves, be sensitive to the needs of others and the environment, be strong in service and hold a global perspective. We are confident you will be a positive contributor to the School community.

The award of this scholarship will attract a 25% reduction in tuition fees as an affirmation of your musical strengths and the personal qualities you will bring to The Friends' School.

As a Friends' Music Scholarship recipient, you are a key role model for other music students and for the wider School community. There is a level of responsibility associated with the scholarship and in addition to observing the requirements of the [Learning Partnership Understanding](#) it is expected that you will:

- Lead by example with the respect that you show for the other members of the School, wider communities and the environment;
- Always wear appropriate School uniform as outlined in the Friends' uniform guidelines;
- Maintain excellent levels of attendance, including being punctual for timetabled classes and school events;
- Have excellent attendance which includes being punctual for classes and school activities, make an effort to engage thoughtfully in class, complete tasks to a high standard and submit by the due date; and
- Contribute positively to the Service Program and School events such as Sporting carnivals and camps throughout your school life. When in Years 11 and 12, fully meet the requirements of the Friends' Certificate if studying the TCE, or the Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) program if studying the International Baccalaureate; and

Specifically, as a Music Scholarship recipient, you are expected to:

- Show an ongoing passion for music;
- In Years 7 to 10, Music must be chosen as an elective where it is not a compulsory part of the curriculum. In addition, students must be involved in a minimum of two ensembles;
- In Years 11 and 12, Music must be chosen as an elective for at least one year where the curriculum pathway allows. In addition, students must be involved in two ensembles or one ensemble in the year they are studying Music;
- At least one of your ensembles will need to be directly related to your primary instrument;
- Be an effective role model and display leadership skills within the School's music community; and
- Be available for music events as required and practical to do.

If at any time you find you are struggling to meet the above requirements, it is essential you seek support from a Senior Staff member or Head of Music. Scholarships will be regularly reviewed and you will be required to have a formal interview at the end of each year, with a more extensive meeting at the end of Year 9. Ongoing concerns may result in the scholarship being rescinded.
